2. Public Comment
No Public Present
3. World's Best Workforce Report
 - Closing Identified Achievement Gaps - Gap between General Education students and Special Education students
 - QComp School and Classroom Goals support closing this gap
 - Last School Year was affected negatively by Covid-19 and the metrics and data reflect this
 - The percentage of all students enrolled in grades 3-8 & 11 at Cyber Village Academy for at least half a school year who are proficient on the Mathematics tests (MCA and MTAS) decreased from 41.2% in 2019 to 19% in 2021. The goal was not met.
 - All Students Ready for Kindergarten
 - We don't have a Pre-K program so we have limited impact
 - Have started having our incoming Kindergarten students come into the building and classrooms over the summer for some testing and sent home materials students and families can use to prepare for Kindergarten
 - Cyber Village Academy conducted a Kindergarten Readiness Assessment and provided targeted learning materials on August 19, 2020 for 64% of incoming Kindergarten students. The goal was not met
 - Idea to have a session for summer school session specifically for the pre-k students
 - All Students in Third Grade Achieving Grade Level Literacy
 - We use NWEA Map Testing to identify students who are struggling and recommend them to Problem Solving and make support plans that may or may not include Title 1 reading or ADSIS services

- 30% of third-grade students attending Cyber Village Academy during the 2020-2021 school year met or exceeded standards on the MCA reading test taken Spring 2021. The goal was not met.
 - All Students Attaining Career and College Readiness Before Graduating from High School
 - Discussed using other measurements like MCIS curriculum for this goal in the future
 - 31% of CVA 8th grade students scored in the 61st percentile or higher in Math and in the 59th percentile or higher in Reading on the NWEA MAP spring 2020 assessment. The goal was not met.
 - All Students Graduating from High School
 - When students “graduate” into a transition program, they don’t count on our graduation rate and this can affect the number as well as students graduating in year 5 or leaving our school and not graduating from another institution.
 - 70% of all 12th grade students enrolled in spring 2021 at Cyber Village Academy graduated in 4 years.
 - Other areas of improvement: State of Minnesota would like to see staff be more diverse and we would like to see that as well
