Cyber Village Academy Equity Committee

The mission of Cyber Village Academy's Equity Committee is to collaborate with and lead the Cyber Village Academy community in cultivating a culture of equity that includes restorative practices and reflects the contributions, perspectives and interests of diverse racial/ethnic groups.

The Equity Committee began meeting in August of 2017 to address issues related to race and education at Cyber Village Academy. During the 2017-2018 school year, members of the Equity Committee conducted an equity audit

at CVA and selected areas of focus for that school year and the 2018-2019 school year. Using the *Pathway to Education Equity Tool*, we identified those focus areas as *Chance to Learn* and *Fair Discipline*.

The Equity Committee is currently working with the Leadership Team, teachers, and staff to aid in developing lesson resource materials and training around implicit bias, culturally relevant curriculum, and social justice education. The Equity Committee is also supporting the Leadership Team in their efforts to address school discipline through restorative practices

As the Equity Committee continues to move forward and create a multi-year plan, we will be seeking additional information, support, and involvement from the broader CVA community, including staff, students, parents, and community members. Attendance is Important!

Whenever possible, parents should send a note to the school prior to the absence. If that is not possible, parents are required to send a note to school with the student when they return including the date, student's name, reason for absence and signature of the parent/guardian.

If a student misses school for more than three consecutive on-campus days due to illness or other medical reason, they must provide a note from a doctor indicating the illness and reason for extended absences. Three consecutive absences can be a Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, or it could be a Wednesday and the following Monday and Tuesday.

- Individual physical activity engagement

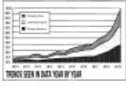

After school pickup



Reminders to make this process as smooth and safe as possible:

CVA students are dismissed at 3:30 pm. **High school students should be picked up at the Hamline Avenue entrance, middle school students should be picked up at the main entrance, and elementary students should be picked up at the Ford Parkway entrance.**

- Please do not park in the turnaround, bus cut-outs, or in any other place that might block the flow of traffic.
- Please stay in your car in line. We will call students by name and load the first 3 cars at a time. Students should not load cars anywhere other than the loading area. This means students cannot cut across the parking lot to their ride, but they CAN walk around the turnaround to get to a parked car.
- If you need to come into the school, please park in the parking lot or on Pinehurst Avenue to do so.
- Students are to wait outside in the loading/unloading areas for their ride to pick them up. Staff members are there to supervise for student safety and to ensure the process goes as smoothly as possible. This means students should not be on the playground if their ride has not yet arrived.
- Students who are not picked up prior to 3:45 pm will be asked to wait in the after-school program room. Starting at 4:00, families will be charged the daily rate for the after-school program (\$10/day).

Study Center Pick up on Thursday and Friday is at the front door.

Family Coding Event at Cyber Village Academy

On Thursday, Dec. 6 from 5:30-7:30 p.m. Cyber Village Academy will be hosting a family coding event as part of the Hour of Code 2018 during Computer Science Education Week. There will be opportunities for beginners through advanced coders. Families with students from Kindergarten through high school are welcome to participate.

Coding is basically giving the directions to tell a computer what to do. Research shows that kids can pick up programming concepts before they know how to read and write. In fact, their brains are more receptive to computer languages at a young age, just like foreign languages. Although participants are requested to bring their own devices (laptops, tablets, smartphones, etc.), there will also be unplugged sessions. A small number of devices will be available to use as well.

A cash-only concessions table will be available that will help fund the CVA technology program.
